At the Monthly General Meeting held in April 1987 it was unanimously passed that appropriate steps be taken to have North Caringbah Junior Soccer Club become an incorporated body under Section (10) of the Associations Incorporations Act 1984.

On 10th September 1987, the then Department of Business and Consumer Affairs, approved the club's application and we became officially known as:

***North Caringbah Redbacks Junior Soccer Club Incorporated***

This is in accordance with the Association Incorporation Act, 1984 No.143.

The Constitution of the Club has been partly based on the Model Rules of this Act (Part 1 Schedule 1).

The by-laws for the day to day administering of the club were passed at the Monthly General Meeting held in February 1988.

At a Special General Meeting held on 18th January 2007 a resolution was passed that the name of the club be changed to:

***Caringbah Redbacks Football Club Incorporated***

The aims and objectives of Caringbah Redbacks Football Club Incorporated are to foster and develop soccer football in the area and by affiliating with the Sutherland Shire Football Association Incorporated, provide competitive games as required for all players who register in the prescribed manner as directed by that Association.

shall do all things necessary to implement and enforce any decision of Football New South Wales and the Sutherland Shire Football Association Incorporated relating to any player, official or person who is a member of this Club or seeks to be a member of this Club.

## REGISTRAR'S REPORT

The process of player registrations went well this year, although it again stretched out well past the initial 6 sessions planned. The last session as always was very popular with almost a third of registrations taken at this time. Lengthy waits had a few hot under the collar ..... if only they came in to earlier sessions.

Registrations were strong again in 2011 with an overall number of 591 players making up 53 teams for the Mighty Redbacks this year. Our teams were made up of 359 junior players and 232 senior players.

Our junior teams continue to build and now represent 40 teams of the overall 53 teams in the club as did our female playing population to represent 202 players.

Date of Birth, Address sightings and photo's went well with 112 new registrations across the age groups. Paperwork for our 591 players was collated and handed into the association in April as required.

Registrations for 2012 will be moving to a new online system that was trialled by several clubs this year and this should reduce the burden on resources throughout the January to April period, allowing players to re-register without coming to the club house.

All new registrations will need to come to the club house for administration of their first rego.

## MEMBER PROTECTION

Caringbah Redbacks FC is committed to ensuring that the health, safety, welfare and wellbeing of children and young people are maintained at all times. Caringbah Redbacks FC is an affiliated member of the Sutherland Shire Football Association (SSFA) and Football NSW and fully supports the child protection policies and guidelines of these organisations, as well as having our own policy in place. The policy is adhered to by the appointed Member Protection Information Officer/s (MPIO) throughout the year.

Our responsibility as a club starts with ensuring that all adult members who have any direct supervision over members under the age of 18 throughout the soccer season are made aware of their responsibilities and must complete a Prohibited Employment Declaration as a legal requirement before any soccer season starts. The MPIO then collects the declarations, collates them and then passes them to the SSFA ensuring compliance with the legislation.

Caringbah Redbacks FC also encourages committee members, coaches, managers, parents, referees and players to read and complete the **PLAY BY THE RULES** online training programs and assessment courses. **PLAY BY THE RULES** provides information and online learning about how to prevent and deal with discrimination in all forms, harassment and child abuse within the sport and recreation industry.

The protection of members extends to all players at our field, in games that we participate in and also to referees, as reflected in the club's Code of Conduct.

Concerns or incidents can be referred to the committee or directly to the MPIO. All matters are dealt with confidentially to ensure the privacy of those concerned. Further advice will be sought if required from the SSFA's MPIO to assist in the outcome.

During the season several reports were lodged with the President of the Redbacks Soccer Club in relation to children being on school grounds during weekends. These children were also found to be climbing on the roofs of the school buildings. Along with these reports it was found that rocks were also being thrown behind the clubhouse and into school grounds.

Please be advised that the throwing of rocks is prohibited at all times and the school grounds are NOT to be entered into, unless retrieving soccer balls.

Just a friendly reminder, can all parents please keep an eye on their children so we can all have a safe, relaxing and enjoyable season of soccer in the future.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

This season has proved to be another great season for the Caringbah Redbacks Football Club. Our registered players increased in numbers by 35 players this year. We registered 591 players at the club this season and had a split of 65% / 35% male to female players. Our percentage of female players in our club is amongst the strongest in the Sutherland Shire Football Association and proved to be one of our strengths this year with two of our senior women's teams making it into Grand Final matches and another women's team just edged out in the semi finals. We saw a strong increase in the numbers for first time players coming to the club this year with increased numbers in the under 6's and 7's. A few champions in the making I'm sure. We had several teams competing in the finals series this year and the Redback's managed to come away with four of our teams winning their grand final matches. Congratulations must also go to all the teams that made it into the finals this year and well done to those that came away victorious.

From a financial point of view we are going well. We are starting to build a bit of a bank balance again after running a successful summer soccer season. This has brought the club back into the black after spending a considerable sum of money on our new clubhouse over the last few years. We still have a bit of work to do to complete the clubhouse fit out but, it is principally up and operational and will provide a great legacy for the club for many years to come. We would like to acknowledge the financial support we received from the NSW State Government this year with a Community Building Partnernership Grant being approved for our Club. This grant allowed the club to undertake the installation of disabled access pathways and the installation of a drainage system in front of the new clubhouse. This has provided the broader community with improved access to the field and will benefit the community for many years to come. A big "Thank You" should also go to Steve Waters Building who undertook the project before the season got underway. There was a very tight timeline to complete the project before the season started. Steve put a significant amount of time and effort into the completion of the project to bring it in on time and on budget. I think we will all agree that this project has been of great benefit to the club and its members.

Our financial position this year has been very close to last year's position. Our total income and expenses were within a few thousand dollars. Our net profit for the year was within one thousand dollars of last year. The club did turn a profit and will look to invest that back into the club with the purchase of some new nets and new goal posts to bring the club in line with the changes in the goal sizes for the small sided football that have been taking place over the last few years. We have modified our aluminium goals to adhere to the goal size requirements and replaced the U6 & U7 goals this season and now need to work towards replacement goals for the U8 & U9 team's requirements. We will also continue to finish the works required to finish off our new clubhouse.

Summer soccer registrations have started strong so far this season. We are again aiming for approximately 500 players in the Summer 7's soccer. We have this year decided to run a division 3 in the men's competition. This will benefit some of our O35 & O45 players who were feeling the pain last year after playing against some of the shires younger and fitter players. There are still openings in the women's and men's and mixed competition but, they are being filled fast.

The committee has again put in place a plan to spend a considerable sum of the summer soccer takings on field renovations at the conclusion of the summer soccer competition. We will end the summer soccer season just prior to Christmas and allow the field some time to re-cooperate before the winter season gets underway. This proved to work well for us last year and we started the season with our field in great condition. The playing surface held up pretty well throughout the season but, as is the norm, it was looking a bit tired at the back end of the season. The work on the field early next year will allow about three months of prime grass growing during the summer months and return the field to a great condition for the 2012 soccer season.
