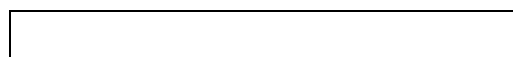

At the Monthly General Meeting held in April 1987 it was unanimously passed that appropriate steps be taken to have North Caringbah Junior Soccer Club become an incorporated body under Section (10) of the Associations Incorporations Act 1984.

On 10th September 1987, the then Department of Business and Consumer Affairs, approved the club's application and we became officially known as:

***North Caringbah Redbacks Junior Soccer
Club Incorporated***

This is in accordance with the Association Incorporation Act, 1984 No.143.

The Constitution of the Club has been partly based on the Model Rules of this Act (Part 1 Schedule 1).

The by-laws for the day to day administering of the club were passed at the Monthly General Meeting held in February 1988.

At a Special General Meeting held on 18th January 2007 a resolution was passed that the name of the club be changed to:

***Caringbah Redbacks Football
Club Incorporated***

The aims and objectives of **Caringbah Redbacks Football Club Incorporated** are to foster and develop soccer football in the area and by affiliating with the Sutherland Shire Football Association Incorporated, provide competitive games as required for all players who register in the prescribed manner as directed by that Association.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

We had another very successful year at the Redbacks. This was my second year as Registrar and the whole registration process was very smooth mainly due to the excellent help I had from other committee members and the My Football Club Registration system.

I would like to say a big thank you to my assistant Registrars this year - Liz Spink and Steve Mason for their help throughout the busy registration process. Also I would like to recognise the hard work of Steve Tobin for his help tracking the Registration payments. I would also like to thank other committee members that gave up their time to assist with the registration process.

We are now 3 years into using the new on-line system and I am pleased to say that out of 560 registered players this year, 220 registered and paid on-line. That's almost 40% of all players. If you take out the 43 new U6 players (as they need to come to the club to be identified) we are almost at 44%. I would like to see this number increase over the next few seasons.

Our registration numbers were down slightly on last year from 571 to 560. This was mainly due to not fielding our over 45 team and losing one of our All Age 8 teams from last year. I am pleased to say though that nearly two thirds of our club (62%) is made up of Mini Roos players under the age of 11. In fact 80% of our Registrations were for Junior members.

This has also ensured there has been no damage to the school or other properties which neighbour our ground. Our Redbacks Committee Members who are on duty during any games will continue to be vigilant in relation to children being behind our clubhouses, on school property or other neighbouring properties.
- Children enjoying football week to week primarily comes from having fun at training and on game day. Whilst there is a focus on skill development, player position and strategy, fun is the element which will bond the team and create lasting memories.
- Ground control support for referees when tensions escalate during games, and to ensure people leave the ground in an orderly manner at the conclusion.

Thanks to all the members and the 2014 Committee for their dedication and support this year.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Well here we are at the end of the winter competition and we are already preparing for the start of the Redbacks 2014 Summer 7's Soccer competition.

This season has proved to be another great season for the Caringbah Redbacks Football Club. From a financial point of view the club is financially secure and the running of our summer soccer competition has been the major fundraiser for the club in the 2013 / 2014 financial year. Summer soccer registrations are well under way and we look to have around 40 teams in this year's competition which is a great result for the club.

We have done some more work towards finishing off the fit out of our new clubhouse. This season we installed a new alarm system and CCTV system to protect the club from ongoing graffiti and vandalism that unfortunately we are subject to on occasions. We still have a bit of work to do to complete the clubhouse but, it is much closer to being finished. When completed, the new clubhouse will provide a great area for the club's members both now and into the future.

The club did turn a profit this year of \$52,036.90 which, has in the main come from the running of the Summer Soccer competition and bank interest. I would like to thank the people who dedicate their time and effort to run the summer soccer competition. The committee will look to invest that back into the club and are considering the stage 3 development of the clubhouse which would include an extension to the canteen with a new BBQ area between the 2 clubhouses with a shaded seating area for members to watch soccer games whilst enjoying a sausage sandwich and a coffee. We are also looking to spend some money on some drainage work which will help to keep us playing on our field during the wetter parts of the season.

The committee has again put in place a plan to spend a considerable sum of the summer soccer takings on field restoration at the conclusion of the summer soccer competition. We will end the summer soccer season just prior to Christmas and this will allow the field some time to re-cooperate before the winter season gets underway. This proved to work well for us last year and we started the season with our field in great condition. The playing surface held up pretty well throughout the season but, as is the norm, it was looking a bit tired at the back end of the season. The work on the field early next year will allow about three months of prime grass growing weather during the summer months and return the field to a great condition for the 2015 soccer season.

Finally, I would like to thank our sponsors for the support that they bring to the club and to our members who make the Caringbah Redbacks a great club.
